News from the Government





1 January - New Year's Interview with Prime Minister Xavier Bettel and Mrs Caroline Mart at RTL. The interview in Luxembourgish (80 min) can be viewed on RTL Télé Lëtzebuerg's website.

11 January - Prime Minister Xavier Bettel took part in the unity rally held in Paris following the terrorist attacks which took place in France. Luxembourg's Prime Minister reiterated his solidarity

with the people of France during these difficult times. Read more...



13-14 January – Jean Asselborn, Minister of Foreign and European Affairs, paid a working visit to the European Parliament in Strasbourg. This visit forms part of Luxembourg's preparations to assume the presidency of the Council of the European Union during the second half of 2015. Read more...

15 January – Jean Asselborn, Minister of Foreign and European Affairs, carried out a working visit to the Netherlands where he met his counterpart, Bert Koenders, as well as Lilianne Ploumen, Minister for Foreign Trade and Development Cooperation. A range of topics were discussed, including bilateral relations, Benelux cooperation, and various international issues, such as the current situation in the Middle East. Read more...

15 January – The Joint Franco-Luxembourg Commission on Nuclear Safety held its 13th meeting at the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs in Luxembourg in order to discuss recent developments relating to nuclear safety and radiation protection. It was a constructive meeting, demonstrating that a good level of cooperation exists between the two neighbouring countries in the field of nuclear safety. A variety of issues were on the agenda, such as recent overflights by drones over several French nuclear stations including Cattenom. Read more...

21 January - British Minister of State for European Affairs, David Lidington, had a meeting with Jean Asselborn, Minister of Foreign and European Affairs, in Luxembourg. The focus was on Luxembourg's upcoming presidency of the Council of the European Union and current political and trade issues such as TTIP. Read more...





21 January - François Bausch, Minister for Sustainable Development and Infrastructure, signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Li Jiaxing, the head of the Civil Aviation Administration of China, which aims to increase the number of flights between the two countries. The Minister continued his working visit to China with a stop in Zhengzou where he held talks with the Secretary of Henan Province, Guo Gengmao. Read more...

22-24 January – Prime Minister Xavier Bettel attended the World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland, where he met various people, including the Prime Ministers of New Zealand and Georgia, John Key and Irakli Garibachvilli respectively. Prime Minister Bettel also held talks with representatives from the technology sector, namely Google and AT&T, as well as meeting with NGOs, such as the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, which was represented by Bill Gates in Davos. 23 January - Jean Asselborn, Minister of Foreign and European Affairs, and Francine Closener, Secretary of State of the Economy, launched the second participatory phase of the Nation Branding initiative at a press conference during which they also presented the results of the first study phase. The study phase included a survey undertaken in October 2014 among residents and cross-border commuters on the country's national identity and defining characteristics. 30 January – Jean Asselborn, Minister of Foreign and European Affairs, attended the official inauguration of the Czech Embassy in Luxembourg along with his Czech counterpart, Minister Lubomír Zaorálek. The Ministers also held bilateral talks and exchanged views on a number of topics including the crisis in Ukraine. Read more...

ECONOMIC NEWS

- ☐ The ASTRA 2G satellite has been launched by SES, the satellite operator based in Luxembourg. According to SES' chief technology officer, Martin Halliwell, the new satellite will improve delivery of various communication services: "ASTRA 2G will enhance and secure existing offerings to major direct-to-home (DTH) markets in the UK and Ireland." Read more...
- Michael Hornsby, Partner and EMEIA Real Estate Funds Leader at EY Luxembourg, has stated in an ALFI podcast that Luxembourg is a leader in the current real estate fund market. He points out that over 300 real estate funds are domiciled in Luxembourg as well as noting that Luxembourg is attractive to real estate fund managers due to its experience in the sector and the available infrastructure. - ☐ A recent publication by STATEC, the national statistics agency, reveals that Luxembourg has the fastest-growing population within the Greater Region (a region which covers the border areas of Luxembourg, Belgium, France and Germany). This dynamic growth can also be seen in the country's employment figures with the number of people in employment having more than doubled since 1990. Read more...
- According to recent figures released by EUROSTAT, the European Union's statistics agency, Luxembourg experienced

the biggest increase in air passenger transport in the European Union in 2013 with an increase of 14.5%. The EU as a whole had an average increase of 1.7% in air passenger transport in 2013. Read more...

- On 13 January, Etienne Schneider, Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Economy and Minister of Defence, and the Luxembourg-based satellite operator SES announced a public-private partnership whose aim it is to launch a satellite in 2017. Both SES and the government would invest 50 million euros in the project. Minister Schneider stated: "this project is not only an important contribution by Luxembourg to European defence, but it further supports the government's economic diversification policy in a key technology sector." - Luxembourg places third in the Global Talent Competitiveness Index published by INSEAD, a prominent international business school. The index rates countries on how effectively they attract and keep talent. Read more...

THE WORLD OF FINANCE

11-20 January - Pierre Gramegna, Minister of Finance, headed a trade mission to South Korea, Japan and Hong Kong. Whilst in Seoul, the Minister met with representatives from 26 South Korean companies interested in expanding into the European market. During his trip to Japan, he met Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance, Taro Aso, and the Governor of the Bank of Japan, Haruhiko Kuroda. He also gave the opening speech at a seminar organised by the Association of the Luxembourg Fund Industry (ALFI), which was attended by over 200 bankers, fund managers and other



industry professionals. In Hong Kong, Minister Gramegna gave a speech at the Asian Financial Forum, which was attended by more than 2400 participants, where he presented the merits of Luxembourg as an effective entry point for Chinese banks from which they can develop within the European market.

16 January – Luxembourg's AAA rating and stable outlook has been confirmed by Fitch. Fitch noted that Luxembourg's economy benefited from a higher five-year average growth when compared to the Eurozone as a whole. Moreover, the rating agency's analysis shows that Luxembourg's financial centre maintains a comparative advantage over other financial centres. Luxembourg has been given the highest credit rating by the rating agencies S&P, Moody's and Fitch. Pierre Gramegna, Minister of Finance, welcomed the AAA rating, stating that it "guarantees the country's attractiveness to investors and the creation of new jobs." Read more...

- The Grand Duke Jean Museum of Modern Art in Luxembourg (MUDAM), welcomed almost 80 000 visitors in 2014, exceeding the forecast of 70 000 visitors by a significant margin. This also marks a 60% increase in visitor numbers since 2009. The museum credits the range of exhibitions held in 2014, which featured the work of such artists as Sylvie Blocher, for attracting the high number of visitors. Read more...

DID YOU KNOW THAT ...




