11 May – On the occasion of the 150th anniversary of the Treaty of London, HRH the Duchess of Cambridge visited Luxembourg, where she was received in audience by TTRRHH the Grand Duke and Grand Duchess and other members of the Grand Ducal family. HRH the Duchess began



her visit at the Grand Duke Jean Museum of Modern Art (MUDAM), where She toured exhibitions by British artists Sir Tony Cragg and Darren Almond, in the presence of HRH Crown Princess Stéphanie and Prime Minister Xavier Bettel. TTRRHH Crown Prince Guillaume and Crown Princess Stéphanie, and Prime Minister Bettel, accompanied HRH the Duchess of Cambridge to both the Luxembourg City Museum and the Dräi Eechelen Museum where they visited the 1867 Commemoration Exhibition about the 150th anniversary of the 2nd Treaty of London. 
23-24 May — Following an invitation from TTRRHH the Grand Duke and Grand Duchess, the President of Portugal, Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa, carried out a state visit to Luxembourg. A visit to Luxembourg City's Corniche and the city's fortifications was followed by a conference at the Cercle Cité. Afterwards, TTRRHH the Grand Duke and Grand Duchess hosted a gala dinner at the palace in honour of the Portuguese President. The second day of the state visit featured visits to SES, the EBRC Data Center, Belval, the University of Luxembourg as well as the National Museum of History and Art. 23 June – During National Day celebrations in Luxembourg, TTRRHH the Grand Duke and Grand Duchess, accompanied by TTRRHH the Hereditary Grand Ducal couple, attended the official ceremony at the Philharmonie, before presiding over the military parade and attending the Te Deum at Luxembourg's Notre-Dame Cathedral. The day ended with a reception at the Grand Ducal Palace, in the presence of the members of the government, the members of the Chamber

of Deputies, the diplomatic corps, and other Luxembourg officials. Read more...



29-30 May – Jean Asselborn, Minister of Foreign and European Affairs travelled to Indonesia for talks with his counterpart Retno Marsudi. Next year will mark the 45th anniversary since the establishment of diplomatic relations between the two countries. Discussions focused on bilateral relations and other issues including the fight against terrorism and the situation in the South China Sea. Minister Asselborn also presented the satellite communications





16-18 June – Prime Minister Xavier Bettel paid an official visit to Romania where he met with the President of Romania, Klaus Iohannis, and the Romanian Prime Minister Sorin Mihai Grindeanu for talks which focused on bilateral relations and issues including migration and the Schengen area. Prime Minister Bettel also met with heads of Romanian companies from

the ICT sector and visited the city of Sibiu, which was the European Capital of Culture in 2007 together with Luxembourg. Read more...



11 July – Romain Schneider, Minister of Cooperation and Humanitarian Action, attended the



Family Planning Summit in London, which was organised by the UK Department for International Development, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and the United Nations Population Fund. Muller progressed to the quarter finals at Wimbledon where he was defeated by Marin Cilic after another

DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

The Treaty of London was signed on 11 May 1867. As a result of this treaty which reaffirmed Luxembourg's independence and neutrality, the Prussian garrison left the Grand Duchy and the city's fortifications were dismantled, transforming the Grand Duchy into an open and modern

nation. This treaty, often called the Second Treaty of London after the 1839 Treaty, was agreed to following the Austro-Prussian War and the Luxembourg Crisis.

As part of the 150th anniversary celebrations of the Treaty of London, the Luxembourg Post Office issued a commemorative stamp. It shows part of the fortification of the City of Luxembourg, the 'Gibraltar of the North', superimposed on the existing park of Luxembourg. The fortifications were dismantled as a consequence of the Treaty of London. Read more...
